DIRECTIONS FOR THE MEETING

By car

Sat-Nav: Please use the postcode HA74LP

From the North, M1: Exit at junction 4, the sliproad passes onto the A41 going south and you need to double back on yourself at the next roundabout to go back up the A41. At the next roundabout turn left onto Brockley Hill (signposted the RNOH). At the brow of the hill, turn right opposite a bus stop into the RNOH.

From the M25: Take the M1 South exit, come off the M1 at Junction 4 and follow directions as above.

From London: Access is via the North circular and then the A41 or Edgware Road (A5).

From the A41: Follow signs through Hendon for Mill Hill. Keep going straight through all traffic lights and roundabouts. At Apex corner take the second exit (straight ahead). Continue across traffic lights until you reach a roundabout. Take the second exit (straight ahead). Continue along the dual carriageway, the sliproad passes onto the M1 (do not take this!!) Stay on the dual carriageway and continue over a bridge to another roundabout. Take the first exit (left) onto Brockley Hill. The RNOH is at the brow of the hill on the right.

From Edgware Road A5: Continue straight along the A5 through all traffic lights until you pass through Edgware. Continue straight through Edgware until you reach a small roundabout. The first exit is signposted Stanmore. Take the second exit to go up Brockley Hill. When you reach the brow of the hill, just

beyond a turning to the left marked Wood Lane, you will find the RNOH on your left.

By air

Stanmore is accessible from Luton Airport (the closest), from Stansted Airport, and from Heathrow. From Luton airport or Stansted airport a taxi will take approximately 45 minutes to Stanmore. From Stansted airport a train goes to Liverpool Street Station. From Heathrow the Paddington Express travels into Paddington Station. Onward travel from Central London is via the Underground (see below)

By Underground from central London

Stanmore is at the end of the Jubilee line accessible from Green Park, Bond Street, Baker street etc in Central London. From Stanmore station a taxi can be taken the short journey either to the hospital or to the Village Hotel.

The Sir Herbert Seddon Teaching Centre

Turn in through the main gates and follow the lane downhill and slightly to your right. At the bottom of the hill and slightly to the left, before a bend to the right is the Teaching Centre straight ahead of you.

Directions from the village hotel to the RNOH, Stanmore

Turn right out of the hotel onto Centennial Avenue. At the roundabout turn right (signposted Edgware, Harrow, A5) and continue to the next roundabout (with a petrol station on your right). At this roundabout go straight across and up Brockley Hill. At the brow of the hill turn right into the Royal National Orthopaedic Hospital.
